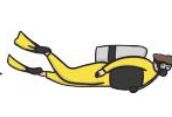

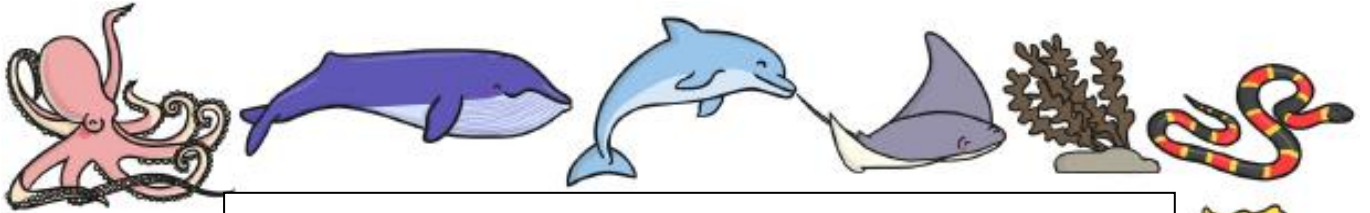
## Example

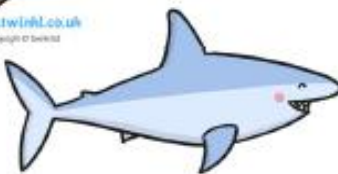
